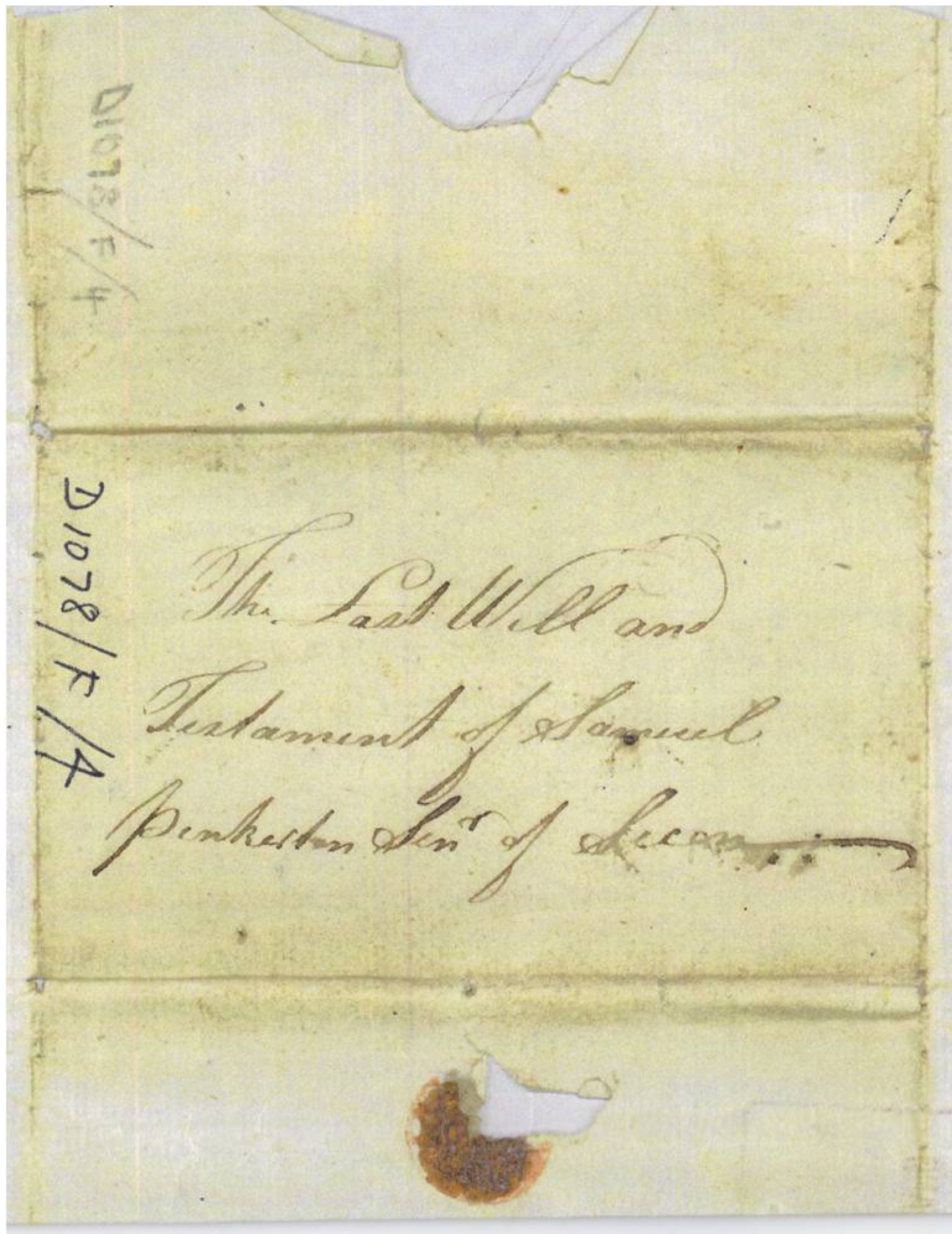


Will of Samuel Pinkerton [1726-1815] of Seacon More, Ballymoney



The Seventh day of July In the
year of Our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred & Eleven In the Name of God Amen

I Samuel Penkerton Son of Secon in the Parish of
Ballymoney & County of Antrim being in firm in
Body but of Sound disposing Mind and Memory do
Make and Appoint this my last will and Testament
in the form and Manner following Viz

To My Son-in-law Robert McKay I leave and bequeath
the Sum of One half Guinea

To My Grandchildren Viz the Children of my Son-in-law
Alexander McKay being Seven in Number at present
I leave and bequeath to each one of those Seven the
Sum of One pound two Shillings and Nine pence ^{half} each

To My Son John Penkerton I give and bequeath all
and singular My Lands & Tenements in Secon
aforesaid With the Appurtenances therunto belonging
at present in my possession Together with all my
farming Utensils Cattle and in a Word of all my Chattels
& Property of whatever description I may die possessed
of Only Subject to the legacies aforesaid
I constitute and Appoint My Son John Penkerton
aforesaid to be the Sole Executor of this My last
Will and Testament Merely Revoking all other

The Will or Wills by me Made or Said to be made In
Testimony Whereof I have hereunto subscribed my
name and affixed my Seal the day and year first
before Written
